We represent The East Alabama Health Care Authority d/b/a East Alabama Medical Center (EAMC) regarding the above referenced Project in which a Certificate of Need was awarded to EAMC to develop the first ambulatory surgery center (ASC) in the City of Auburn, and the first free-standing ambulatory surgery center in Lee County. Pursuant to ALA. ADMIN. CODE r. 410-1-10-.03 (SHPDA), EAMC requests a Project Modification for its CON, for the reasons expressed herein.

Consistent with r. 410-1-10-.03(1)(b), a filing fee in the amount of \$7,790.30, which is 35 percent of the original CON Application fee, has been submitted electronically.

Relevant information supporting the modification, including an Executive Summary and projected costs and financial information, is provided in Exhibit A hereto. As addressed in r. 410-1-10-.03(2), the modification will not involve the addition of beds, a change in bed classification, or the provision of new health services not specified in the CON Application.

The modification will involve a change in the square footage of the ASC from approximately 20,000 square feet to 24,145 square feet. EAMC seeks a modification from two procedure rooms to four procedure rooms. This will allow more surgeons to utilize the ASC.

Instead of leasing the facility from a private developer, EAMC will develop and own the facility. EAMC anticipates incurring construction costs of \$13,960,580 instead of having only build-out costs associated with a capital lease. The estimated expenditure for movable equipment will remain the same. The total Project cost will be \$22,369,974, and financing will be through new revenues and cash on hand.

EAMC's CON Application was opposed by a group of local surgeons, all of whom are presently on staff and provide surgical services at EAMC. EAMC and several of the surgeons formerly opposed to the Project plan to work together.

#### IV. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF THE PROJECT

The East Alabama Health Care Authority d/b/a East Alabama Medical Center (EAMC) proposes to expand ambulatory surgical services to an off-site location in the City of Auburn. Specifically, the location would be in Auburn Research Park, a 171-acre development adjacent to Auburn University begun in 2008 as a result of a partnership between the State of Alabama, the City of Auburn and Auburn University. EAMC operates several off-site health and medical services in the City of Auburn.

EAMC proposes to expand ambulatory surgical services by the addition of four general anesthesia operating rooms, four procedure rooms and support space consistent with applicable standards for ambulatory surgical facilities. The ambulatory surgical facility will be 24,145 square feet in a mixed-used building to have a total of approximately 86,000 square feet. EAMC will be the owner of this building.

Today, EAMC conducts all ambulatory surgical activities in Lee County at the main hospital facility located in the City of Opelika. These ambulatory activities are performed in several areas within the main hospital facility including main ORs, GI Lab, and other areas. Approximately, 17,500 various ambulatory surgery cases are performed annually at EAMC; however, not all these cases can be performed in an ambulatory surgical facility.

EAMC's cost for the project is estimated expenditure of \$4,347,500 for movable equipment and \$13,960,580 for facility construction. Some of the equipment cost would be expended anyway if EAMC did not expand ambulatory surgical services to the proposed off-site location as such equipment would support activities at the main hospital facility. This estimate assumes no equipment would be relocated from the main hospital facility to the off-site ambulatory surgery facility; thus, no off-set equipment cost is considered at this time.

EAMC is the only hospital in Lee County. EAMC is the safety net for the medically underserved in Lee County including low income Medicare residents as well as those with inadequate insurance and high out of pocket deductibles/copayments. For 2016, EAMC's charity care and bad debt was approximately \$50,000,000. Customers that pay for ambulatory surgery services support other activities at the main hospital including emergency room, cancer services and others. One of the key reasons EAMC can be a safety net hospital for the community is due to its vibrant and profitable ambulatory surgical services.

Furthermore, EAMC has partnered with the community of Chambers County. You will find a number of support letters from persons living in Chambers County. For several years, the hospital in Chambers County (Lanier Hospital) found itself struggling. EAMC was approached and agreed to take over Lanier's operations. Subsequently, EAMC merged operations of EAMC-Opelika with those of EAMC-Lanier. This early action by EAMC has assisted in stabilizing EAMC-Lanier.

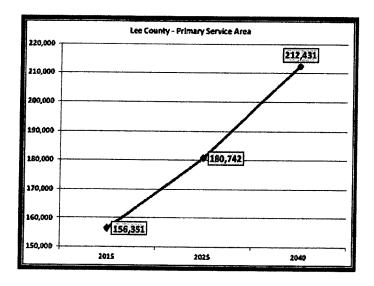
Today, EAMC-Lanier is on the path to a brighter future instead of becoming another closed hospital in Alabama. The partnership with EAMC-Lanier is one example of EAMC carrying out its mission and vision. EAMC cares to serve the individuals in the secondary service area as well as the primary service area of Lee County. While the proposed project is to be located in Lee County,

we believe the residents of Chambers, Macon, Randolph, Russell and Tallapoosa will support and benefit from the proposed project.

Depending on the clinical service line, approximately 35 to 50 percent of the patients that use EAMC reside outside Lee County. EAMC's patient centered approach and its commitment to a high level of quality care has been and will continue to be the motivating focus for the people working at EAMC in Opelika, Alabama, Chambers County and elsewhere.

EAMC is and has been fortunate to be located in Lee County, the home of Auburn University who is the largest employer in east Alabama. As a result of this dynamic and positive economic growth and thriving business development, the population of Lee County is forecast to increase by double digits, which should foster growth in ambulatory surgery.

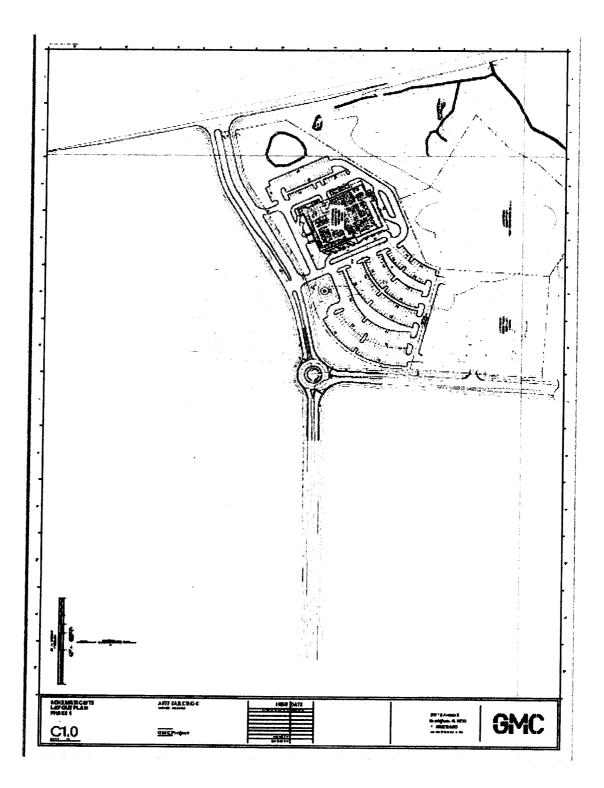

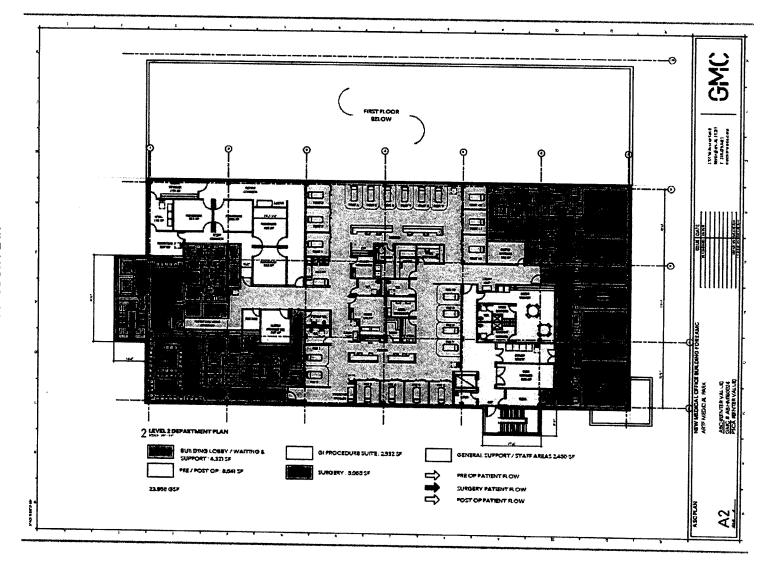
