Dear Ms. Marsal:

This law firm represents The Tombigbee Health Care Authority, which owns and operates Whitfield Regional Hospital (the "Hospital"), located in Demopolis, Alabama. Hospital has been in operation for over 70 years in Demopolis, Alabama. Demopolis is located in Marengo County, Alabama, which is a county designated as rural by the U.S. Census Bureau/CMS (formerly the Health Care Financing Administration). Please see the attached report (generated on December 8, 2021, by the Rural Health Information Hub, which is funded by the Federal Office of Rural Health Policy) that confirms the Hospital is classified as rural by the federal government.

The purpose of this letter is to request confirmation in writing that Hospital is not subject to CON review prior to reopening the obstetrics services/program at the Hospital, which closed in February of 2014.

The following information is provided to assist in evaluating this request:

- 5) <u>Financial breakdown</u>:

6) No other health care facility has a financial interest in the proposed project.*

As of September 24, 2021, the CON thresholds are \$3,165,569.00 for major medical equipment, \$1,266,226.00 for new annual operating costs, and \$6,331,138.00 for any other capital expenditures. All of the projected expenditure amounts for this project are well within the three thresholds. In addition, Section 22-21-263(a)(4), Code of Alabama 1975, exempts hospitals classified as rural from the requirement of obtaining a Certificate of Need for certain Institutional Health Services that would otherwise be subject to review. Pursuant to Ala. Admin. Code Rule 410-1-7-.02(7), no fee is included with this letter, as Hospital qualifies as "rural."

Upon receipt of your agency's approval, Hospital will apply to the Alabama Department of Public Health ("Public Health") for approval of the construction plans, and then enter into a construction contract and equipment purchase contracts in Marengo County, Alabama. Public Health requires written confirmation of the Hospital's exemption from CON review before it will proceed with the approval of the construction plans.

^{*} Hospital has a management agreement with University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB), which went into effect after the obstetrics services program was closed.


